Lights would greatly improve the usability of the skatepark. Installing lights would allow skaters to continue using the park past dusk and lower the risk of injuries when continuing to skate as the sun is setting. Otherwise, the skatepark is almost perfect with its current configuration. There are very little skateparks in the Bay Area with similar obstacles that are completely oriented to technical ledge & manual skaters. The ledges are of perfect varying heights and grind smoothly. The rails are also great for learning tricks and are perfectly oriented to maintain the flow of the park. I cannot think of small improvements to the park that would NOT change the current flow and configuration.	The current configuration of the park should NOT change. It is easy to flow around the park in circles and hit all the obstacles in one long line. They current ledges are long and are of varying heights, allowing skaters to learn a new trick on a small obstacle and carefully take it to a bigger obstacle. The only feature that would be an excellent addition is a small half pipe or bowl section. But being that these obstacles take up a large area, I would hate to see any current feature be demolished to make space for a half pipe or bowl. The adjacent tennis court and baseball field hardly get any use and if some of that space could be used to expand the skatepark, that would be optimal.
The skatepark is perfect as is. The multitude of skateparks within the greater Bay Area offer plenty of traditional, identical-looking skatepark obstacles from which Shoreview is a breath of fresh air. Its existing layout is ideal for the creatively minded and quick-footed skater/scooter rider/biker and should be preserved accordingly. The only thing that could possibly improve the skatepark is an expansion of the total surface area to open up some of the tighter corners (notably, the corner entrance parallel to the sidewalk running down the third baseline of the baseball field). <p>Shoreview skate Park is a very special, iconic skate park for the Bay Area skateboarding community a paragraph when it was first built.
