Operational Update

- Current Health Officer order still in effect
 - More restrictive than State order
 - No curbside retail in San Mateo County at this point
- Emergency Operations Center virtual as of today
- City Hall re-opening task force continuing preparations
 - Planning for June 1st opening

Operational Update

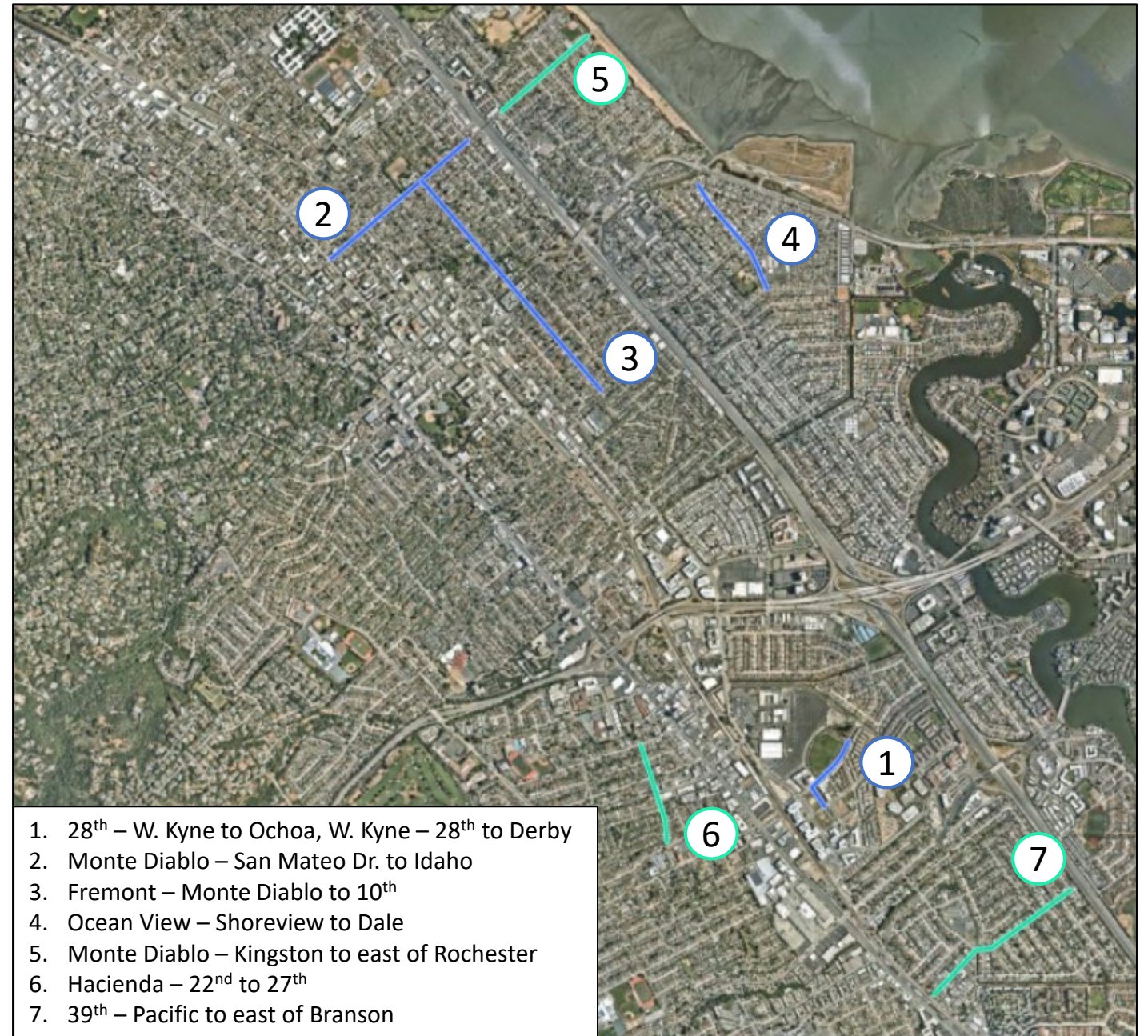
- Heavy development services activity
 - 147 online permits submitted
 - 329 building inspections conducted (50% virtual/50% on site)
- Restaurant re-opening support efforts
 - Survey sent to restaurants
 - Task force being formed
 - Restaurateurs, Chamber, DSMA, staff
 - May require municipal code amendment related to alcohol
- Golf course re-opened successfully last Wednesday
 - 1,062 rounds through Sunday (1,070 rounds last year for comparable period)

Redeployment and Business Outreach

- Redeployment
 - 18 total employees in redeployment, 18 assigned
 - 5 employees trained and doing census outreach
- Business outreach
 - 1,087 calls made through May 8th
 - Initial calls made – restaurants, ground-floor retailers, and personal services
 - Childcare outreach continues
- Business assistance grants
 - 54 available grants for San Mateo businesses; 289 applications
 - Name of business grant awardees will be provided in the coming weeks

Safe Streets Initiative

- Monte Diablo and Fremont – moving forward; implementing this week
- Bay Meadows - operational, additional A-frames added at intersections
- N. Shoreview – Bike Safety messaging signage on Bay Trail (to be extended to all of Bay Trail in City limits)

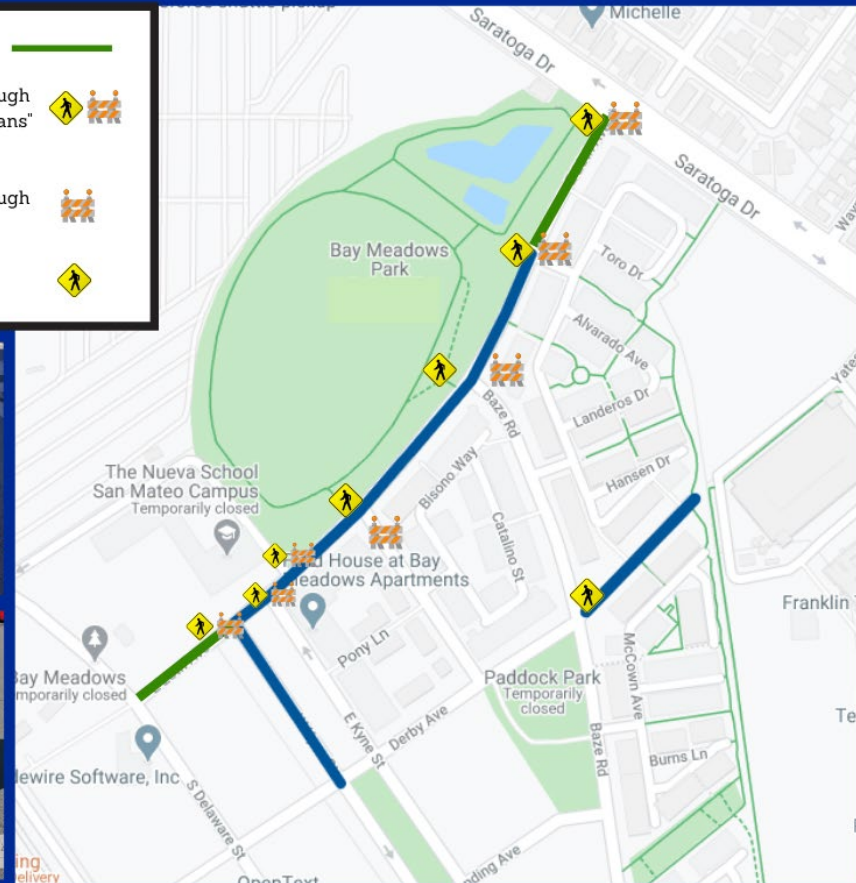

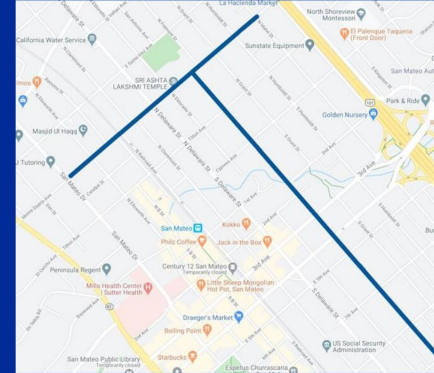

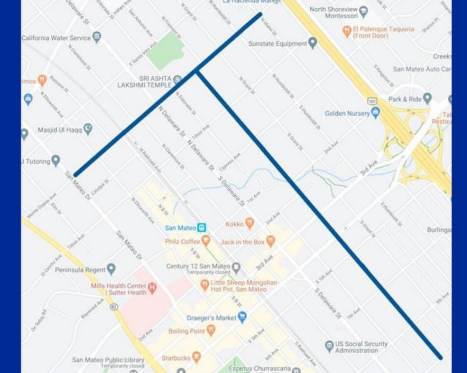
