June 15, 2020

Health Orders Update

- County submitted variance request to State on June 12th
 - Approval would allow County to align with State's Resilience Roadmap
 - Dine-in restaurants, salons, wineries/bars, gyms among businesses that could be allowed to re-open
- If approved, Dr. Morrow would issue revised orders
 - Defining additional businesses allowed to operate
 - Conditions/restrictions that would be applied

Operational Update

- City Hall open since June 1st
 - Limited staffing and limited walk-in traffic
 - Continuing to encourage appointments and online service

Library

- Curbside pickup available; worked through existing holds in first two weeks
 - New materials available for checkout on June 16
- Curbside service begins at Marina and Hillsdale Libraries on June
 16

Operational Update

- Parks and Recreation
 - Summer Programs
 - Reached 84% of capacity for Session I Summer Camp registrations
 - 625 registrations for virtual programs, e.g. fitness, specialized children's camps
 - 750+ tennis court registrations
 - No aquatics programming this summer due to limited programming capacity based on required health guidelines
 - Parks update
 - Open: Open spaces, skate parks, Japanese Garden, tennis courts, bocce courts, most parking lots
 - Closed: dog parks, playgrounds, picnic areas, formal athletic fields, basketball courts

Operational Update

- Public Works
 - Street sweeping resumed today
 - Enforcement planned to begin in 30 days
 - Will have robust outreach and communications plan
 - Aligns with downtown meter enforcement
 - Also planning for RPPP enforcement in 30 days
 - Safe streets initiative
 - Monte Diablo operational and being monitored
 - Staff working with neighborhood on adjustments to Fremont
 - Moving segments onto residential streets
 - W. Kyne fully closed; 28th still closed to through traffic

Council Confirmation

- Council confirmation requested for the need to continue local emergency
 - California Government Code Section 8630

- Council confirmation requested of actions to be taken in response to emergency proclamation
 - Resume parking enforcement for street sweeping/RPPP in 30 days
 - Defer July rent for tenants of City-owned property
 - Postpone City Services Academy to Spring 2021

Special Meeting Consideration

- Consider holding special meeting June 22 or June 29
 - Eviction moratorium ordinance expires June 30th
 - Ballot measure arguments
 - Measure P
 - Alternative Measure
 - Transient Occupancy Tax
 - Update/direction on parklets and street closures
