

# Transient Occupancy Tax Measure


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
## Background

- City's budget is facing a \$7.8 million structural deficit
- Fiscal sustainability plan
- Council direction to explore an increase to the City's hotel transient occupancy tax (TOT)
  - Current TOT is 12% proposal is to increase it to 14%
- Survey on feasibility of TOT issued between May 19-29
  - Support was 72% after voters learned about measure

# **Proposed Hotel Tax Measure**

- 2% increase bring San Mateo's TOT to 14%
- Anticipated \$1 million in additional annual revenue
- Only applies to overnight guests of hotels, motels, short-term rentals
- General tax requires 50% +1 voter approval

## **Proposed Ballot Language**

To fund general city services such as:

- Maintaining streets and repairing potholes;
- Providing fire, paramedic, and 9-1-1 emergency response;
- Managing traffic congestion;
- Maintaining parks, recreation and community facilities, infrastructure, and general city services

Shall an ordinance be adopted increasing the City of San Mateo's existing transient occupancy (hotel) tax paid by hotel/motel guests to 14%?

# Council Actions

#### Motions to:

- Adopt a resolution to call a general municipal election on Nov. 3, 2020 for the purpose of submitting a proposed ordinance to increase the City's transient occupancy tax by 2%
- 2. Introduce an ordinance to amend provisions of Chapter 3.56 Transient Occupancy Tax of the San Mateo Municipal Code to increase the City's existing hotel transient occupancy tax by 2%
- Approve the primary argument in support of the measure to be included in the voter information pamphlet and (direction on rebuttal argument)

# Ballot Arguments

(primary published Aug. 14, rebuttal due Aug. 24)

Motion to approve the primary argument in support of the measure to be included in the voter information pamphlet and...

#### Options for rebuttal argument:

- Delegate subcommittee to write and submit a rebuttal argument on behalf of council
- Direct subcommittee to draft rebuttal argument for council review at the Aug. 17 meeting
- 3. Direct subcommittee to draft rebuttal and hold a special meeting before Aug. 24 for council review
