On behalf of the San Mateo City Council, I am writing to express the Council's strong support of the City of San Mateo's grant application for the Caltrans Sustainable Communities program for the proposed San Mateo Complete Streets Plan. This plan seeks to make streets safe and accessible for all modes and abilities, and will implement context-sensitive design approaches to increase citywide mobility by identifying priority areas and projects based on a data-driven collision analysis effort.
