



COVID-19 Update

April 5, 2021

Health/Vaccine Update

- County in orange tier since March 17th
- Vaccine eligibility expanding
 - April 1 – Anyone over 50 years old
 - April 15 – Anyone over 16 years old
- County holding community vaccine clinics in San Mateo
 - Targeting eligible, at risk residents
 - March 27th: 404 shots administered
 - April 3rd: ~600 shots administered
- Bay Area Community Health Advisory Council also doing targeted vaccine events for vulnerable populations



Restaurant, Brewery, and Winery Relief

- City contributed \$300,000 to program; County added \$220,000 for San Mateo businesses
- 179 total applicants from San Mateo; 131 deemed eligible
- Based on existing funding, 52 grants awarded
 - 79 eligible businesses not funded
- Any future contributions can fund remaining need



Operational Update

- Recreation
 - Consolidation of LEAP at King Center starting April 12 (72 students)
 - Continued need through remainder of school year
 - Expected to need \$114,000 to finish school year with LEAP
- Accepting small group (3 household max) picnic reservations starting April 9
- Summer activity registration begins April 5
 - Includes children's camps and small group swim lessons



Operational Update

- Library
 - Lobbies opened at main/branches March 29th
 - Facilities expected to open at limited capacity May 3rd
- City Manager's Office
 - Business recovery task force being formed
 - First meeting on April 19th



Council Confirmation

- Council confirmation for actions taken in response to the emergency proclamation
 - Continued funding of LEAP for remainder of school year
 - Continued waiver of business tax penalties and interest for certificates expired on 3/31/21
 - Penalties and interest have been waived since 3/31/20
