## CITY OF SAN MATEO RESOLUTION NO. \_\_\_\_ (2021)

## APPROVING ALTERNATIVE PURCHASING PROCEDURE FOR A PURCHASE ORDER WITH CDW-G FOR THE PURCHASE OF REPLACEMENT PERSONAL COMPUTERS

WHEREAS, the City replaces personal computers for staff use on an ongoing basis once they have exceeded their operational lifespan; and

WHEREAS, the City has identified approximately 80 personal computers that have reached the end of their operational lifespan under the replacement schedule; and

WHEREAS, Municipal Code section 3.60.070(h)(3) provides that the City may use purchasing procedures approved by the City Council if the City Council makes a finding concurrent with the award for the contract that the procedures are in the best interest of the City for the particular contract; and

WHEREAS, the City as a public sector agency may participate in the National Intergovernmental Purchasing Alliance (NIPA) which offers contracts that have been competitively bid and negotiated; and.

WHEREAS, CDW-G is a participating vendor under a current NIPA contract; and

WHEREAS, CDW-G is the preferred vendor due to the quality of its customer support and services; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Information Technology has determined Lenovo brand personal computers purchased from CDW-G best meets the City's needs since Lenovo brand personal computers have proven to be of high quality, reliable, and with a low hardware failure rate.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN MATEO, CALIFORNIA, FINDS AND RESOLVES THAT:

- 1. This Council action is exempt from CEQA, because it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility the purchase of personal replacement computers may have a significant effect on the environment. (CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3).)
- Pursuant to Municipal Code section 3.60.070 (h)(3), the purchase of approximately 80 personal computers from CDW-G through the National Intergovernmental Purchasing Alliance (NIPA) is in the best interest of the City because:
  - The NIPA procurement service offers competitively priced contracts for goods and services; and
  - The NIPA procurement service avoids costs normally associated with the development of highly technical bid specifications, while assuring that competitive prices were received.
- 3. The purchase of approximately 80 personal computers in a total amount not to exceed \$135,500 is approved.

- The purchase order to CDW-G for approximately 80 personal computers in a total amount not to exceed \$135,500 is approved, in accordance with the terms of the NIPA Contract Number 2018011-01 through the City of Meza, AZ.
- 5. The Director of Information Technology is authorized to execute the purchase order on behalf of the City.
