APPROVING AN AGREEMENT WITH SAN MATEO RESOURCE CONSERVATION DISTRICT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES FO CA SB 1383 COMPOST PROCUREMENT PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT

WHEREAS, CA SB 1383 is a short-term climate pollutants reduction act requiring, in part, all jurisdictions to procure an amount of organics recycling product (compost/mulch) in proportion to the amount of organics generated in that jurisdiction based on population; and

WHEREAS, the City's 2022 target is over 8,000 tons; and

WHEREAS, the San Mateo Resource Conservation District (SMRCD) Compost Broker Program is a collaboration between every city and town within San Mateo County, the County of San Mateo, and the SMRCD to help the City meet our SB 1383 recycled organic waste product procurement target.; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Municipal Code section 3.60.050 (g) agreements may be awarded without competitive bids if calling for bids to contracts with other governmental agencies; and

WHEREAS, City staff recommends approval of the agreement with San Mateo Resource Conservation District for CA SB 1383 Compost Procurement Program Development.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN MATEO, CALIFORNIA, HEREBY FINDS and RESOLVES that:

1. This Council action is not a project subject to CEQA, because it is not a 'project' subject to CEQA as can be seen that it has no potential to result in either a direct, physical change in the environment or a reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment. (CEQA Guidelines Section 15378(a)).
2. In accordance with Municipal Code section 3.60.050 (g), calling for bids would be an exception because:
 - a) San Mateo Resource Conservation District is another governmental agency;
 - b) Compliance with CA SB 1383, a short-term climate pollutants reduction act.
3. The agreement with San Mateo Resource Conservation District, for professional services for CA SB 1383 Compost Procurement Program Development, in the amount not to exceed of \$73,216.26 is approved.
4. The Public Works Director is authorized to execute the agreement in substantially the form

submitted and approve subsequent amendments to provide substantially similar services, on behalf of the City.
