NEW BUSINESS

1. <u>General Plan Update – Draft Goals, Policies and Actions for the Land Use, Community Design and Historic</u> <u>Preservation, and Safety Elements</u>

Deputy Director, Zachary Dahl, and PlaceWorks Consultant, Joanna Jansen, presented an overview of the General Plan Update.

Commissioner Questions:

Commissioners asked clarifying questions on density limits for R4 zoning, land use designation, current plans for sea level rise, local historic preservation objectives, and fiscal neutrality.

Public Comments:

Four members of the public – Drew, Catherine Marreiro, Robert Whitehair, and Laurie Hietter – addressed the Commission with comments on the General Plan Update, including installing additional street lighting, adjusting environmental risk areas, completing grade separation through downtown, sound mitigation along the railroad corridor, requiring height transitions for large development projects adjacent to residential areas, strengthening historic presentation requirements and establishing additional historic districts, set stronger climate change policies, and address the job-housing imbalance.

Commissioner Comments:

Overall, the Commission expressed general support for the comments provided by the GPS and made comments about the need for some policies to be more focused and, in many cases, include stronger language. For the **Land Use Element**, comments included establishing additional policies to address the City's jobs-housing balance; supporting the inclusion of environmental justice policies and actions in the General Plan; and strengthening policies related to climate change. For the **Community Design and Historic Preservation Element**, comments included clarifying what the term "character" means in the General Plan; avoiding stark differences in building mass within a

single block; and updating the language in the historic preservation policies and actions to align with some of the comments in the Heritage Alliance letter. For the **Safety Element**, comments included identifying sea level rise is an important hazard to consider in the General Plan; providing an emphasis on emergency readiness in the equity priority community areas; and adding policies focused on reducing per capita energy use.

The Commission moved to recommend to the City Council that the draft goals, policies, and actions for the **Land Use Element** be updated per the Commissions input provided at this meeting before being incorporated into the Draft General Plan.
