1. Why would you be interested in serving on the San Mateo City Council?

To further justice and equality throughout our city and promote the appropriate policies to achieve those goals. As I have consistently done as a planning commissioner I would base my decisions, as the planning commission handbook requires, on what would be best for all of San Mateo, not just special interest groups.

The environmental challenges we face as a city are quite daunting and to be a part of a group that could put together sustainable policies, infrastructure and resilient programs would be very exciting. To champion those goals would be of great interest to me as a council member.

2. How much time would you be able to commit to serving on committees outside of regular Council business?

Ten to twenty hours a week determined by the issues at hand that need to be addressed and the urgency of time constraints.

3. What skills do you possess which qualify you to fill this office?

I am a good listener, have an open mind and am willing to make decisions that are best for the community yet may initially reflect poorly on me. I am not nor have ever been beholden to any campaign contributors or special interest groups.

4. Please discuss your experience with civic leadership and community engagement in San Mateo.

I have been in leadership roles, while serving on both the Sustainability Commission and the Planning Commission, for the last eight years. My experience has been one of learning both procedurally and policy wise. Interacting with the public and understanding their viewpoints has taught me a tremendous amount of the importance of public engagement in the decision-making process.

5. Describe your experience working in a group, receiving information, and arriving at a consensus in decision making.

My 45 years of construction management taught me how to work as not only a team leader yet to facilitate thought inducing dialogue to come to a consensus on difficult issues. I have been able to lean on that skillset to listen to conflicting opinions, keep an open mind for the best outcome and convey it in a manner that the whole group feels acknowledged and included.

6. What do you see as the City's top 3 challenges and how would you tackle them?

Climate disruption. Every public safety building, the new sewage plant, large swaths of the city
from the bay to the El Camino, major highways and our power grid are in extremely high rick
hazardous areas. We need to take inventory of our most important facilities, acknowledge the
possibility of displacement for neighborhoods and have plans in place for redundant power
sources to make us a more resilient city.

The first thing I would do is aggressively educate the public to the dangers we face, set priorities to address the most pressing ones and apply for grants to the state and federal agencies to be matched with local funding sources.

2. Housing and transportation. These two issues can and both can be solved which in turn will help us reduce our GHG emissions. The city went through a downtown specific plan recently and its key finding was that to be financially viable 20,000 people needed to live downtown. With a combination of TOD along the rail corridor line, increasing the number of residences in downtown and along the El Camino Real coupled with a highly efficient Accessory Dwelling Unit program we can address our housing needs. Locating most of the new housing in the above-mentioned areas of the city would remove some of the pressure on the existing neighborhoods of going through radical changes yet still being able to help reduce the overall housing crisis through the ADU program.

Concentrating housing in high density, walkable areas with services and jobs is how cities have been developed for centuries. With the advent of the automobile suburbs were developed and that substantially changed the way societies functioned. We are in a time that is demanding us to again change how we live our daily lives. It is time to meld the suburbs with metropolitan features to form a new way of using our resources and planning.

To expand housing downtown will be a boom to the small business through not only more shoppers yet also in attracting and keeping the work force it cannot get today because of the lack of affordable housing. Affordable housing works as an economic engine and will also reduce GHG by reducing long distance commutes for low paying jobs. The expansion of office buildings in recent years has turned us into an employment center and now supplying housing for those high paid workers and the low wage workers who come to serve them is an urgent issue.

Another component of the housing issue is the rapidly changing demographics of our region. We have an aging population with its own special needs in housing. Housing near services is attractive to both the millennials and aging baby boomers. What we are building today for the work force has a strong possibility of being occupied by retired folks who will then need to sell their single-family homes. Building enough walkable neighborhoods and keeping our economy strong enough to make the single-family homes an option for as many workers to purchase will be highly important as we move forward.

To me one of the most effective and cost-efficient programs is the ADU model. A good program will make the permit process steam lined and simple to understand, all utility hook ups to be reduced in cost from their exorbitant high fees and school impact and city fees reduced substantially. If the city were to be part of a Public Bank funding could also be made available at a reduced rate to property owners.

Taller denser housing near transit and amenities, a strong ADU program, a vibrant downtown all with less use of vehicles will lead to reduced traffic and healthier lifestyle.

1. Why are you interested in serving on the San Mateo City Council?

As a third generation San Mateo resident and homegrown product who attended K-12 in the City of San Mateo, I want to give back to the community that made me who I am today.

A few of the fond memories I have of my time in San Mateo include:

- Trick or Treating on Halloween all throughout San Mateo
- Selling Gift Wrap Paper while at San Mateo Park Elementary School to fundraise
- Commuting via SamTrans to Borel Middle School
- Acting in School Plays at Borel Middle School and celebrating at the old Fridays Restaurant
- Losing every Little Big Game while attending San Mateo High School but still enjoying the school pride
- Playing pool at the Great Entertainer and paying \$5 a day to bowl at Bel Mateo Bowl
- Wrestling Varsity my Freshman Year and placing First as an undefeated team in our division at San Mateo High School
- Wrestling at both San Mateo High School my Freshman and Sophomore year and at Aragon High School my Junior and Senior year
- Working at my Uncle's shop, Works of Wicker, on El Camino Real in San Mateo
- Walking my dog around Central Park and letting him play at the local dog park

These memories are the things I want to preserve for current generations of San Mateo residents and businesses, which relate to quality of life issues, public safety, access to a sustainable future and more.

If appointed and provided the privilege and honor to serve, I would work closely with every Councilmember, City Staff, and the community to ensure the Strategic Priorities of the City are achieved.

I also want to make my family proud who has served in various civic leadership capacities in San Mateo and across the Bay Area. My mother and father were honored by the Organization of Chinese Americans (OCA) San Mateo Chapter as the Community Leaders of the Year in 2018. My mother also worked with the late Congressman Tom Lantos and former Congresswoman Jackie Speier to secure funding

to preserve the Alien Files at the National Archives, immigration records that trace the history of the travel of immigrants to the US including San Mateo families that would have otherwise been lost forever. My mother's cousin, Melodie Lew who is a current San Mateo resident, has also served as a Trustee on the San Mateo/Foster City School Board. My other mother's cousin, Ginger Lew, grew up in San Mateo and has served under several Presidents, most recently as former Senior Counsel to President Obama's White House National Economic Council. This strong legacy of San Mateo activists and civic leaders drives me to give back to my community as an appointed Councilmember.

I also declare here in writing that I would not seek re-election in 2024 when this appointed term expires.

2. How much time would you be able to commit to serve on committees outside regular Council business?

I would be willing and able to serve on any committee, attend all community events and outreach meetings, as well as host my own town halls and community outreach events to ensure the community is heard and their priorities translated into action.

Experience, Demonstrated Civic Leadership, and Understanding of the Issues Supplemental

3. What skills do you possess which qualify you to fill this office?

I know I can hit the ground running on day 1 and contribute not only to the public policy decisions that will face the City Council in the next two years, but also by enhancing community engagement, building public trust in City governance, and bridging political divisions within the community.

I have worked at all three levels of governance (Federal, State, and Local) for two members of Congress, two San Jose City Councilmembers, and for CA Governor Gavin Newsom. This provides me with insight on how to accomplish the goals of the City when jurisdiction may be out of our hands.

As a former Sunnyvale City Councilmember, I have experience in all duties and responsibilities of a Councilmember. A few of the examples below exemplify the skills that I have to execute these responsibilities with integrity:

Engaging the Community and Ensuring their voice is heard

- On every Council item I voted on, I would ask local community groups and thought experts their opinion on the proposed city staff recommendation which would help guide my vote
- I also engaged City Commissioners to understand their recommendations and proposals of new studies
- I also notified relevant stakeholder groups of upcoming hearings to ensure their public comments were heard at hearings, regardless if I agreed with them or not on the matter at hand
- Managing a Budget during tough economic times
 - Managed a budget of nearly \$600 million for multiple fiscal cycles and made tough decisions during the COVID-19 pandemic that prevented all layoffs of current employees
- Holding Developers Accountable and Negotiating Community Benefits through Development Agreements
 - Lead the charge to hold developers accountable and ask for more from the developers of Sunnyvale's new downtown project, Cityline, where I was able to secure free transit passes for low-income residents of affordable housing and a ten year agreement concession from the developer to host a free community room to be rented out by the City's local nonprofits and community partners to host meetings and events in the heart of the City
- Creating Open Space and Addressing Equity
 - Negotiated a joint budget motion to pass the creation of a new park in the City and the creation of an Office of Access, Equity and Diversity in the City
- Sponsoring new Programs and Using Technology to Solve City Problems
 - After multiple tries, got funding through the budget to study the establishment of a formal Smart Cities Strategy to not only evaluate new opportunities to invest in low-cost and high-ROI technologies to serve the community, but also establish the City as a thought leader in the space helping to qualify the City for new funding opportunities to subsidize the procurement of these technologies through grants and donations from non-profits
- Serving on Internal and External Intergovernmental Committees
 - As Chair of the City's Grants Committee, saw the execution of multiple funding rounds to local neighborhood associations and nonprofits and increased the funding amount for these groups
 - As a Board Member on the VTA Policy Advisory Committee, made multiple successful motions to amend the direction of the Committee to

keep the community in mind when making decisions that impact traffic flow and access to public transit

- Working with Elected Officials and Stakeholders across different jurisdictions and levels of governance
 - Advocating as a Councilmember to local elected officials including County Supervisors, State Senators and Assemblymembers and US Congressmembers and Senators to keep local control and pass funding directly to Cities rather than through other agencies like the State or County so that the residents can directly realize the benefits of new laws, funding sources and programs
 - Partnering with these elected officials through Town Halls and community forums to ensure the community's priorities are translated into action that shape city laws and programs.

4. Please discuss your experiences with civic leadership and community engagement in San Mateo.

I currently am a member of the San Mateo Chamber of Commerce and serve as a member on the Committee's Policy Committee.

I have also worked with the Organization of Chinese Americans (OCA) San Mateo Chapter as well as the Asian Pacific-American Leadership Institute to increase civic engagement through voter registration, workshops on running for office and serving on city commissions, and more.

5. Describe your experience working in a group, receiving information, and arriving at consensus in decision making.

I am a team player and always professionally respect every opinion regardless whether I ultimately agree or disagree with the idea being discussed. At the end of the day, we are all public servants who want to do right by the community, even though we may disagree on what right looks like and how to accomplish the goal in mind.

As a former Councilmember, I have actively amended my own motions to incorporate feedback and desires from my colleagues that have ultimately increased the votes in support of a motion towards a unanimous decision, even when I did not fully agree that the resulting motion was the best decision. In these instances, I have often tried to get the motion correct on the first try through a Council discussion of a potential motion that incorporates the feedback and desires of my colleagues during the question and discussion period of a hearing of an agenda item.

I have also done my homework prior to hearings and asked questions of staff prior to a meeting as to get the data needed for the entire Council to make the most informed decision possible, regardless if I agree with the outcome or not. Oftentimes, these questions were transparent to the rest of my colleagues through notes that city staff would provide to each of us of the questions asked by all Councilmembers.

6. What do you see as the City's top 3 challenges and how would you tackle them?

COVID-19 Recovery and Quality of Life

We have to help San Mateo residents and businesses get back on their feet during these times of pandemic recovery hindered by sky high inflation. The inflation we have seen over the past year alone has drastically caused hardship to all San Mateans causing housing evictions which contribute to homelessness issues, our youth not getting the nutrition they deserve due to choices between rent and groceries, and more. The consequences of the pandemic also still need to be addressed such as the education gaps of our children resulting from learning loss, small businesses closures unable to pay back their PPP loans, and more.

One of the actions I would execute to address the quality of life and pandemic recovery priorities is to partner with my colleagues to ensure that the budget report for FY 22-23 includes a survey from the community of their priorities and the quality of life issues most affecting them. This data would help to inform how the Council amends the proposed budget and reallocates funding towards these priorities.

For example, if the community needs more rental assistance for low-income tenants, then the City could reallocate how it spends its HUD Home Grant dollars to reallocate funding temporarily towards Tenant Based Rental Assistance (TBRA). If the community wants to see more traffic enforcement officers as traffic picks up during the pandemic recovery with companies requiring return to in-person work, then the rehiring of frozen vacant positions could be prioritized towards traffic enforcement officers versus other units to ensure safe routes to school and 0 pedestrian and bicyclist fatalities and collisions.

As a former Councilmember, I have experienced acting on this priority first-hand by voting to uphold the State and County's temporary eviction moratoriums, sponsoring the Sunnyvale Cares program which provided grant funding to local small businesses struggling to keep their doors open, and more.

Public Safety

We have to ensure public safety for our residents that supports our officers and also addresses the concerns from the community around transparency, accountability and responsible use of personal information.

As a City Councilmember, I would partner with the City Manager, Chief of Police and the Police Department to execute equitable community outreach to build trust in the community through our neighborhood associations and community groups.

I would also ensure through the budget process that the City Manager and Chief have all of the tools necessary to make the right decisions when it comes to policing, enforcing the law, assigning patrol beats and traffic enforcement officers throughout the City, partnering with the County Health Agency to serve our homeless community and more. An example of this would be investing in 21st Century tools that help to increase efficiency in the department that help to drive data-driven decision making processes. I would also look out for opportunities to secure community benefits that directly serve the Police Department when the City is able to negotiate a development agreement such as securing funding to help rebuild aged-out infrastructure. Technology could also improve the department's ability to analyze its data which helps to inform City Council and community reports as well as power public facing dashboards on crime statistics.

Environment

We have to ensure that we move towards a net zero carbon future as set by the State's goals as well as to ensure a sustainable future for generations of San Mateans to come.

I would work with my colleagues to evaluate the effectiveness of the City's current Climate Action Plan and ensure that we comply with all State required mandates such as SB 1383. I would also work with City Staff to ensure we are applying to the right grants and securing the funding to accomplish this.

I would also advocate to our State and Federal elected officials on the priorities that serve us such as ensuring that Peninsula Clean Energy can continue to exist, thrive, and provide the lowest cost renewable energy source to our residents and community.

I served on the City of San Mateo Planning Commission prior to my election to the City Council. The City will be finalizing our Housing Elemental and the broader General Plan over the next two years and I will bring my extensive Council and planning commission experience to the table.

In December 2019, at the end of my second 4-year term on Council, I moved to the City of Menlo Park to live with my husband of five years. Since then I have stayed actively involved in San Mateo continuing to chair the oversight and fundraising committee for the San Mateo Memorial for Fallen Heroes in Central Park and I served on the San Mateo Police Activities Board through 2020.

Following the unexpected passing of my husband 7 months ago, in October I moved back to the home I have owned for in San Mateo for 43 years.

The ability to listen, compromise, collaborate, build consensus, and work as a team member was critical to achieving the Council's goals and appropriately serve our community. In addition, the

ability to read, review, and analyze complex and detailed reports, financial data, and planning documents was an essential component of my Council responsibilities.

6. What do you see as the City's top 3 challenges and how would you tackle them?

I believe San Mateo has a number of challenges that we continue to address, and I believe that Housing, infrastructure, and public safety are among the 3 top challenges facing our city.

Housing:

During my tenure on City Council, housing was a major challenge and continues to be so today. Providing adequate housing, especially affordable, workforce housing needs to be a priority. I will work to ensure that new building projects in the pipeline provide an adequate amount of affordable housing. I also believe it is important to balance office construction with housing by building enough new housing to support office projects being proposed.

I will work to ensure our housing element is passed and that in the process we are building housing where it makes sense without compromising the character of our single family neighborhoods.

Infrastructure:

As San Mateo sees growth in new housing and construction of office spaces, we have to evaluate the impacts on our infrastructure and identify how to appropriately match that growth with our infrastructure needs, such as providing adequate pedestrian safety, improved traffic mitigations, updating our parks and recreation centers, adding additional parks to meet the growing population, addressing the impacts on public safety, etc.

Public Safety:

Public Safety continues to be a priority for our City and in my experience, it continues to be the number one concern of our residents. It is imperative we support our public safety, both law enforcement and fire services, to ensure we have adequate staffing and that we address recruitment and retention, and appropriate training. I also believe it is important to support community policing and improved community outreach and resident engagement. Programs like PAL play a critical role in achieving this goal.

Public safety was always one of my key priorities when I served on City Council. Because of my commitment to public safety, I am proud to have the support of our prior police chief, Susan Manheimer.

Personal Statement Supplemental

1. Why are you interested in serving on the San Mateo City Council?

I have served on many committees and Boards within the City of San Mateo, San Mateo County and the State of California. I have lived in our City for 52.5 years and know it well. I believe I can help work through our problems and celebrate our accomplishments as a City. I have done the background work to prepare for serving on the City Council.

I have attended the City of San Mateo Citizens Police Academy and the City of San Mateo Citizens Academy. I have a good relationship with past and present City Council members. I am collegial with all whom I have served. I began my service for the City of San Mateo in 1998 -1999 by serving on Community Compass for the City of San Mateo. Community Compass was a visioning group regarding the future of San Mateo. I served on the City Charter Revision Committee with Larry Atkins, Mayor Jane Baker and myself in 2002. I have been a delegate to United Homeowners Association and from 1996 to the present. I have served on twenty-nine Boards Commissions, Committees and nonprofits since 1996.

I want to serve because I believe I can make decisions for the City without respect to any political alignments. I have the knowledge, energy, and experience to do a good job for our City. Also, it is time that District four has a representative. This district includes the underserved part of San Mateo with the residents who do the hard physical work that serves the rest of us. They need someone who will work for the entire City, but be a voice for them now, not in 2024, but now. District four has unique problems that need a voice now. District four provides a great deal of income for the City with Transit Occupancy Tax, Transfer Tax and Sales Tax.

2. How much time would you be able to commit to serving on committees outside regular Council business?

I will have more than enough time to serve on all of the committees both in our City and outside of our City. If fact, I now serve on the C/CAG "Lifeline Transportation Program Cycle Scoring Panel" that disperses available money for micro transit. In the last scoring panel, we recommended money be granted to San Mateo for the "Get Around" program that produces eight taxi rides per month for seniors in the City. I am on three local and regional advisory committees that take around 25 hours per month just for meeting time, not counting prep time. I am also on several other boards and committees that often can require a great deal of work. In addition, I engage in many hours of community work to bring our community together. In short, being on Council will require that I resign from most of these committees including

3. What skills do you possess which qualify you to fill this office?

I have a broad knowledge of the Brown Act, the Bagley-Keene Act and Robert Rules of Order. I have served on Boards and Commissions for the City of San Mateo, the County of San Mateo, regional commissions and 16 years on a State Board. I have always served collegially with the other appointed members. In fact, when I served for 16 years on the Board of Barbering and Cosmetology, I led the effort to make it a more friendly Board. With the help of one other Board member, I made the effort to bring the groups together. It took one other board member and me about nine months, but the Board became very collegial.

I do not send angry emails; I don't talk about colleagues with whom I disagree. I do not go onto social media and make comments when I am on the winning side of a vote. In short, I don't do anything to demean anyone with whom I disagree. As an example, I have been honored by the County Labor Movement for my work on behalf of Workers. I also was honored in 2017 by the Greater San Mateo Chamber of Commerce. My comment at the Chamber meeting when I was honored was that just because we disagree today, does not mean we can't work together tomorrow. I will work with anyone who is willing to work with me. In short, I have the knowledge and skills that will allow me to work efficiently and productively to keep this the great place to live that it has always been. I have the temperament and wisdom to work with everyone on the City Council. You can see from the GPA in my education that I have the ability to quickly learn what I need to know. If I am appointed, I doubt I will disappoint.

4. Please discuss your experiences with civic leadership and community engagement in San Mateo.

I will rely on my resume as an offer of proof of the vast experience I have in working with staff and other members of boards and commissions. I educate myself about every board or industry on which I have served. I have discussed my experiences with Civic leadership in the questions above and my resume. I was appointed to the California Board of Barbering and Cosmetology three additional times after serving a first term. If the staff and legislators were not pleased with my performance, I would not have been reappointed to the Board. My reappointments were in spite of the two-term recommended limit. I am still in touch with many of the board members and staff on the boards on which I served. My experiences have all been good. I enjoy learning about the material and I am committed to work with and sometimes lead others in my work on the boards, commission, and committees on which I have served.

5. Describe your experience working in a group, receiving information, and arriving at consensus in decision making.

It is clear that I have a great deal of experience with community leadership and community engagement in the City of San Mateo, the County of San Mateo, the Region and the State of California. I have already discussed some of the ways I work for consensus. I believe the key is simple, review the agenda and all of the material. Meet or contact staff if you do not understand some of the material, but you must become very familiar with the material and the issues surrounding the agenda. Secondly, you should draw some conclusions on what needs to be done with an item on the agenda, but never make a full decision until you go to the meeting and listen to the staff, colleagues and most importantly, the public. Discuss fully your ideas and listen carefully to you colleagues and the public and then make a decision. Never ever make a colleague or the public member believe their ideas do not have merit. Never reply to an idea posed by a member of the public. Always remember it is public comment not public debate. Make sure you always congratulate a colleague when they make a helpful addition to the debate. Never ever resort to email, texts or social media to discuss the ideas of your colleagues. I do my best to always smile and greet everyone. I find that simple gesture helps improve someone's bad day.

6. What do you see as the City's top 3 challenges and how would you tackle them?

Our greatest issue is pension debt. Without funding for our city services our city will decline. That and other issues is why I agreed to chair, co-chair and work to pass five tax measures for the City of San Mateo. I have raised around \$95,000.00 to set up phone banks, prepare and mail fliers, prepare material for volunteers to walk precincts and use social media. I have done all that because the city needs to maintain a balanced budget and place money in reserves for a bad year or years.

Pension unfunded Liability is one of the largest financial issues hanging over our City's head.

I will try and explain the issue with the City's Staff pensions: As of 2021 we owed PERS (the pension fund) \$248,000,000.00. The return on investment for PERS in 2021 was 21%. The 21% return on investments dropped our unfunded liability to \$177,000,000.00. However, the projected return on investments for PERS for 2022 is -07.5. If that projection holds true to the end of the year the City's new debt to PERS will be \$284,000,000.00. In addition, to funding our staffs' annual pension, the costs to the City is another \$10,000,000 that we send to PERS this year. Again, this year the projected return on investments for PERS -07.5%.

There is hope because of the Brown pension reforms that the debt should smooth out to (0) by 2050. There is very little or maybe nothing the City can do to avoid these obligations. These

are vested benefits after five years with a PERS contracted City. Several cities have tried to rid themselves of some of there pension obligations and have failed in the courts. The cities that have tried also lost large number of the safety personnel and had a very difficult time recruiting replacements.

Infrastructure is the next very important challenge to San Mateo. We have proposed to rid our City of all failed streets by the end of 2024 when we passed the Measure S. With the escalating cost of construction material, it becomes more difficult to complete the work in the time proposed. The cost of fuel, the cost of equipment and the cost of labor is going up even before the fast-rising cost of inflation.

Finding qualified employees for City staff is becoming more difficult. There are qualified employees looking for work, but the cost of living here stops them from taking employment with the City. That is not the only problem for the city. In a wider view our residents are finding it difficult to find help around the home and business are having trouble staffing their operations. My dentist had to cancel my appointment because he lost a dental hygienist and he can't find a replacement.

Part of the problem is a lack of housing for the people who work in San Mateo or San Mateo County at a cost they can afford. One solution is to build more housing near services like grocery, restaurants, medical and small service providers. Also, to provide housing near easy to access transportation for those willing to take public transit like myself. However, that is not the only way to retain workers. Public employers and private employers will have to find a way to offer salary and benefits that will allow workers to have enough money to support themselves with a little left over to enjoy life. No one will live here if they can only eke out an existence.

I will be happy to answer any other question.

1. Why are you interested in serving on the San Mateo City Council?

San Mateo is a community with diverse groups of people, fantastic public spaces and unmatched food and culture. However, for too long we have lived in a city with insufficient infrastructure in transportation, housing and climate change resiliency. Investing in the city's infrastructure presents one of our greatest levers to improve our most vulnerable citizens' lives and to unlock opportunities for all our families. For instance, our public transport system can be greener and more accessible. We can double-down on our housing initiatives to make housing more affordable, all while preserving elements of the City that people hold most dear. We should forge ahead to complete the construction and expansion of the Wastewater Treatment Plant. I want to serve on the Council because I have experience across the non-profit, business and civic sectors, positioning me to make an immediate contribution on the San Mateo City Council.

2. How much time would you be able to commit to serving on committees outside regular Council business?

I'm a parent and homeowner in San Mateo. I work full-time, as does my spouse. Neither of us have family in this area. We're immigrants from Latin America. While our situation isn't representative of every family, our perspective is an important one to be represented on the Council. If appointed to the vacancy on the Council, I can commit to excellent preparation for all of the Council's business, and spend time getting to know ALL councilmembers well. I'm a dual citizen of the U.S. and Mexico and want to serve as a "bridge" between various communities and among stakeholders with different perspectives.

- 2. <u>Planning</u>. Experienced in leading strategic planning efforts in non-profit, public and private sectors. Understand the importance of balancing short- with long-term priorities.
- 3. <u>Stakeholder management</u>. Extensive experience managing public and private stakeholders, and an ability to mediate divergent interests to reach consensus.

4. Please discuss your experiences with civic leadership and community engagement in San Mateo.

I am proud of my community involvement. I want to serve on the City Council to formalize my involvement and to grow my impact.

- 1. <u>Before the pandemic</u>, I hosted several "Café con la directora" (Coffee with the principal) events at my home for families in our neighborhood to come meet Sunnybrae's principal, learn about the school, and to find ways to support their local public elementary school.
- 2. <u>During the pandemic</u>, I partnered with the new Sunnybrae Elementary principal to raise funds to help families impacted by the pandemic. Also, my son (6) and I were regular volunteers distributing groceries to families at Congregational Church of San Mateo (CCSM) on Sunday mornings. Also at CCSM, I served as interpreter for a father and child from Guatemala who were separated at the border, and who were living at CCSM. I served as an interpreter to help get this family on its feet.
- 3. Coming out of the pandemic, in October 2021, I joined the CuriOdyssey board where I chair one of the Board committees. I am also a member of the San Mateo County Leadership Council class of 2023, a civic leadership program to help public and private-sector leaders grow their involvement in the County and in civic affairs.

5. Describe your experience working in a group, receiving information, and arriving at consensus in decision making.

I appreciate how important it is to invest in a good working relationship with fellow council members and the city manager to support the City's organizational performance and reputation. My experience working in a group is extensive. My approach to decision-making is as follows:

- 1. What Is Going On? Understand the historical context and the status of an initiative or proposal. Seek to understand the various perspectives in support or in opposition to the initiative. If possible, speak to the stakeholders on multiple sides and to members of the public. Having gathered information from a broad set of stakeholders, form an initial point of view with an articulation of pros (+) and of cons (-). Who does this initiative benefit and hurt? What might be some of the unintended consequences of the initiative?
- 2. **Articulate the Options**. On paper, flesh out the various options, including doing nothing. Discuss the options with Council members and together highlight any associated trade offs (the things you won't do if you support this initiative).
- 3. **Be an Honest Broker**. If there's no consensus on which option is best, consult stakeholders and the public again. Incorporate the feedback and come back to discuss this as a Council. If there's disagreement, reframe the initiative to help surface shared interests. Build off shared value and help any Council members shy away from digging in their heels. Acknowledge there are no perfect solutions but build a sense of shared pride around the decision, even if the decision doesn't go my way. Communicate the outcome to the public.
- 6. What do you see as the City's top 3 challenges and how would you tackle them?

1/ Stewardship of Infrastructure.

- Examples of today's challenges: Dated transportation fleet; Old water and sewer-treatment facilities; Unsafe roads and crosswalks.
- <u>Desired future state</u>: Green public transportation fleet; Completed construction and expansion of the wastewater treatment facilities, updated sewer piping; Improved safety on roads and intersections with more people moving by bike and by foot.

2/ Fiscal health

• <u>Examples of today's challenges</u>: External factors like rising inflation, increasing cost of living and lingering impact of Covid on businesses and on tourism.

• <u>Desired future state</u>: Secured additional sources of revenue. Closed unfunded commitments. Relocated displaced businesses. Grew tourism to pre-Covid levels.

3/ Equity

- <u>Examples of today's challenges</u>: We live in neighborhoods divided by income and race; Educators and public servants can't afford to live here; Disparate life outcomes.
- <u>Desired future state</u>: Increased social-connectedness with high and low-income children building meaningful ties; Increased supply of affordable and workforce housing; Invested early in climate resiliency.



1. Why are you interested in serving on the San Mateo City Council?

In my family, public service and civic engagement are seen as, in part, an obligation to our community and, in part, a benefit of living in any community. From my first (pre-law school) job as a legislative aid to a Congressman, to my current commission and general plan service and board presidency of charities, I've tried to stay involved in community affairs and promote the well-being of my neighbors. Serving on the City Council would be another forum for 'giving back,' contributing to the common good of all in San Mateo, and helping shape and benefit the community in which my family and I live.

2. How much time would you be able to commit to serving on committees outside regular Council business?

Sufficient time to prepare and serve as appropriate. I'm still a partner in my law firm, but I've scaled back my practice in recent years to about one half of the time and effort it use to require. Upon appointment to Council I would, of course, cease being a commissioner. And I term out of my board (and presidency) position at Samaritan House at the end of June of next year. My daughter is in college now, so my wife and I are 'empty nesters' allowing even more time for civic efforts.

3. What skills do you possess which qualify you to fill this office?

I would bring experience, demonstrated civic leadership, and understanding of the issues to Council. I also have a track record of reaching out to, and listening to, all sides and working to achieve the best solution for all involved.

As an attorney (primarily corporate, but early in my career an appellate and legislative advocate) I analyze facts and situations and negotiate to agreed outcomes on a regular basis. I've applied these skills to my long time commission efforts and have helped shape community actions and assist City staff and the Council in coordinating public input, needs, and desires and the implementation of public policies.

When I moved to San Mateo (from San Francisco) 24 years ago I soon got involved with my neighborhood (San Mateo Park) association and was exposed to City zoning and variance issues and the role of the parks department in addressing our neighborhood's many islands and street trees. Then, at the urging of my neighbor (and then County Supervisor) Jerry Hill, I joined the San Mateo County Parks and Recreation Foundation.

This eventually led to an appointment by the San Mateo City Council to the Park and Recreation Commission where I served for 8 years (including several terms as Chair) and worked on diverse issue ranging from heritage trees, in lieu fees for capital improvements, new park facilities, to (the surprisingly controversial) dogs in parks. After terming out, I was then appointed to the Public Works Commission and was asked to stay on when it merged and became the Sustainability and Infrastructure Commission where I currently still serve as Chair. On that commission I have navigated clean water upgrades, flooding/overflow/storage tanks, small cell towers, circulation, and other issues with staff and Council.

5. Describe your experience working in a group, receiving information, and arriving at consensus in decision making.

There are many, many such experiences in my years as a commissioner.

One notable example surrounds an issue that might not have seemed so significant in political circles at the time but was surprisingly contentious. For many years dog owners ran their pets off-leash in a number of City parks (in contravention of the established rules) mostly on the playing fields. At one point, a dog got away and attacked a pet that was being walked nearby. Residents on all sides, pet owners and non-pet owning park users, particularly athletic groups who were unhappy with droppings on the fields, complained to Council. Council quickly passed the matter down to the Parks Department. I was chair of the commission at that time, and in coordination with staff we set hearings on the issue.

The crowds that came out were huge – larger than any we had known before on any Parks and Recreation issues -- and very vocal and emphatic on all sides. We gave all involved, the dog supporters, athletic groups, and other park users, multiple opportunities to voice their concerns and, correctly, be and feel 'heard.' Then, in coordination with staff (and after a little municipal code research) we determined that the Parks and Recreation director actually had authority, without need to go up to Council, to put in place a pilot program to address the situation. With outreach to all stakeholders, we managed to establish a pilot program that included time and location limits on off-leash park use, some modest infrastructure upgrades to increase safety and access to resources (like doggy bags), organization of citizen groups to self-monitor behavior, and increased City clean-up opportunities. The result was a true win-win.

6. What do you see as the City's top 3 challenges and how would you tackle them?

The City's top three challenges in my view (and experience) are housing, circulation (traffic and infrastructure), and services and support for lower income residents.

The housing shortfall requires support for truly smart development and respect for the needs of all in our community. We have to recognize the reality that we are a largely built-out City and with few opportunities and resources for City sponsored or funded development. That means developing in in-fill and upgrade opportunities and recognizing the need for developers to build, within our mandates and guidelines, but projects that make economic sense. Continuing, and I believe more aggressively, encouraging mixed use development and higher density development along transit is the course we should follow. Transit should be broadly viewed to include major roads as well as public rail transit to maximize reasonable opportunities. Mixed use, higher density residential and commercial together where possible, more efficiently utilizes space and affords residents with living spaces and available nearby services. The updated general plan, while still in process, should provide a reasonable roadmap to help the City in this endeavor.

Circulation – traffic and infrastructure – issues also need to be addressed. These matters are an important 'ends' in and of themselves. Smooth streets, bicycle lanes, better pedestrian access, and safety upgrades are all required by our residents and visitors as they move about the City for work and access services, shopping, and entertainment. But these matters have increased importance as we work to meet our housing goals as new residences mean more people and more strain on our infrastructure. We owe it to our existing residents and those we hope to accommodate with increased housing to prioritize traffic and infrastructure, both with focus and resources to keep this a livable and enjoyable City for all.

For my part, going through (and chairing) the general plan process has shown the many opportunities to better meet housing needs while maintaining and improving much of the character of our near suburb community.

The childcare facility shortage in our area is an issue that draws less attention than some, but I believe it needs to be focused upon in a greater and a more urgent way. One of the impediments to our City's ability to support our hugely important workers and households, particularly at the lower income range, is the lack of accessible and affordable childcare that would allow folks to enter and stay in the workforce, better afford to stay and live in our City, and more quickly move up the income ladder as well.

The recently developed childcare fund to support private day care is a step in the right direction. I believe greater, and more urgent efforts and resources should be directed this way. In addition, I believe there is a place for City funded day care as well, particularly in some of the lesser served parts of our community. We need to look at how a number of the City's facilities could be upgraded (necessary to obtain licenses to provide full day and week care) and developed as possible to meet this need.
