Receive an informational report highlighting the Sustainability Program and Public Works Department Work Plans for FY 20-21 and FY 21-22.

BACKGROUND:

At the October 14, 2020 Sustainability and Infrastructure Commission meeting, the Commissioners requested staff bring forward a report summarizing the Sustainability Program and Public Works Department work plans for upcoming fiscal years. The work plans focus on major initiatives and Council priorities and do not summarize all tasks taken on by staff. Often, initiatives span multiple fiscal years.

Sustainability Program Work Plan

FY 20-21

- 1) Adopt and implement reach codes (2019 Code Cycle)
- 2) Expand public electric vehicle charging infrastructure
- 3) Explore adoption of San Mateo County's Disposable Food Service Ware Ordinance
- 4) Research Commercial Building Benchmarking Ordinance approaches
- 5) Explore implementation of rebates / incentives for electric appliances
- 6) Conduct online outreach programs

FY 21-22

- 1) Research reach codes for 2022 Code Cycle (begins January 2023)
- 2) Expand public electric vehicle infrastructure and explore municipal electric vehicle fleet policy
- 3) Implement Disposable Food Service Ware Ordinance
- 4) Research and adopt Commercial Building Benchmarking Ordinance
- 5) Expand on rebates / incentives for electric appliances and battery storage
- 6) Expand multifamily composting
