SUBJECT:

Sewer System Management Plan – Five-Year Update and Recertification

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt a Resolution to recertify the 2021 update of the Sewer System Management Plan.

BACKGROUND:

On May 2, 2006, the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) adopted Order No. 2006-0003-DWQ - Statewide General Waste Discharge Requirement for Sanitary Sewer Systems (Statewide WDR) that applies to agencies that own or operate sanitary sewer collection systems greater than one mile in length. The Statewide WDR requires that the City develop and adopt a Sanitary Sewer Management Plan (SSMP) with the purpose of providing proper and efficient management, operation, and maintenance of the City's sanitary sewer system. The Statewide WDR also defines the requirements for Monitoring and Reporting Programs (MRP) for sanitary sewer overflows (SSOs). On August 6, 2013, the SWRCB adopted Order No. WQ 2013-0058-EXEC, which amended the Statewide WDR requirements related to the Monitoring and Reporting Program (Amended MRP). The SSMP must be approved by City Council at a public meeting.

The City Council approved a resolution in January 2016 that recertified the previously updated SSMP and staff has completed the required five-year update to the document. The draft 2021 SSMP is available for review. The updated SSMP incorporates all the requirements of the Statewide WDR and Amended MRP.

BUDGET IMPACT:

There are no costs associated with Council recertification.

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION:

In accordance with CEQA Guidelines Section 15061 (b)(3), Sewer System Management Plan Recertification to the City Council is not a project subject to CEQA in that it can be seen with certainty that this action will have no effect upon the environment. Capital projects listed within the Sewer System Management Plan document will require their own individual environmental clearances.
