Caltrans 101 Express Lanes Project Sewer Relocation - Agreement

### RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt a Resolution to approve a utility agreement with Caltrans for the relocation of sanitary sewer facilities required to facilitate the Caltrans 101 Express Lanes project; and authorize the Public Works Director to execute the agreement in substantially the form presented.

### BACKGROUND:

The San Mateo Highway 101 Express Lanes Project (previously called the 101 Managed Lanes Project) is a multi-agency project, sponsored by San Mateo County Transportation Authority, City/County Association of Governments of San Mateo County, and State of California Department of Transportation (Caltrans), to provide express lanes in both directions of Highway 101 from Whipple Avenue to Interstate 380 in San Mateo County. This \$500 million project is part of a corridor-wide vision to implement a continuous express-lanes system on Highway 101 throughout Santa Clara, San Mateo, and San Francisco counties.

The project includes highway widening in some stretches through San Mateo to accommodate new traveled lanes. The lane widening will necessitate relocation of existing highway sound walls, modifications to City frontage roads, and relocation of City sanitary sewer facilities. All construction work will be performed by Caltrans, including the work to relocate the sanitary sewer facilities.

The City will provide design review and construction inspection oversight of the sanitary sewer relocation work. The City's review and oversight efforts will be provided by existing staff and are estimated to cost \$30,000. All the efforts, including the City's \$30,000 estimate, for the sewer relocations are 100% Caltrans expenses. The interagency utility agreement clarifies this agreed upon scope, responsibilities, and expense approach.

### BUDGET IMPACT:

Caltrans payment will be applied to the Sewer Fund operating revenue to offset the City's review and inspection oversight costs, which are included in the adopted 2019-20 operating budget. As such, no additional budget appropriations are necessary.

### ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION:

Council action on this item is within the scope of the Environmental Impact Report prepared by Caltrans and certified in November 2018.
